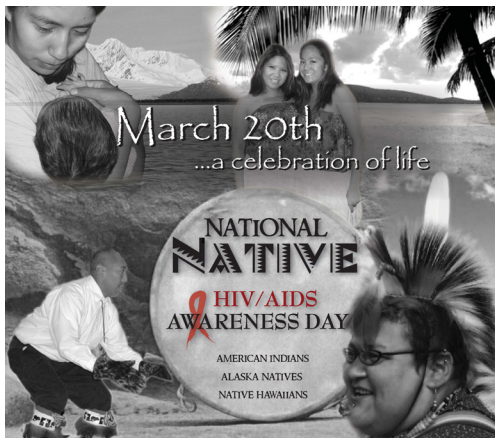


# Save the Date
